Awareness cum Training programme on "Safe and Judicious Use of Pesticides"

One day on-campus awareness cum training programme on "*Safe and Judicious Use of Pesticides*" was organised by HIL (INDIA) Ltd in collaboration with KVK Dimapur, ICAR Nagaland Centre at KVK Dimapur campus on 16th February, 2024. Chief Guest of the programme, Shri. James Swu, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Medziphema, Govt. of Nagaland in his address apprised the farmer to use pesticides judiciously and to apply practically in their field whatever is learned from the training programme. Dr. H. Kalita, Head

of Regional Centre, ICAR Research Complex for NEH Region, Nagaland Centre in his address briefed the farmers on different types of pesticides available for agriculture use. He urged the farmers to use the pesticides in the right dosage and to follow proper handling and timing. He also made aware the farmers how to identify the types of pesticides based on colour markings from the labels.



Shri. Bodevi Shuya, District Agriculture Officer, Chumukidema in his address requested the farmers not to overuse the pesticides as it will affect our health and environment. Shri. Rajender Thapar, Deputy General Manager, HIL (INDIA) Ltd highlighted about the activities taken up by their company for the improvement of the farming community across India. In his speech he informed the gathering that a total of 160 trainings have been conducted so far benefitting around 20,000 farmers through this training programme.
